


# Quick start guide

This quick start guide provides you with basic instructions only. For more complete instructions, refer to your user's manual provided in the package, or see the online user's manual at www.smbtelephones.att.com.

#### Base unit installation



NOTE: If you subscribe to digital subscriber line (DSL) high-speed Internet service through your telephone line, you must install a DSL filter between the telephone line cord and wall jack. Contact your DSL service provider for more information about DSL filter.



- 1. Plug one end of the DC power cable into the adapter jack of the base unit, and plug the other end into the **\$B3014** jack of the power adapter. Route the cord through the slots.
- 2. Plug one end of the telephone line cord into the **TEL LINE** jack of the power adapter, and plug the other end into a wall jack.
- 3. Plug the small end of the AC power cord into the power jack of the adapter, and plug the large end into the wall outlet not controlled by a switch.



Caution: Use only the AC power adapter provided with this product. To obtain a replacement, visit our website at www.smbtelephones.att.com or call 1 (800) 222-3111. In Canada, dial 1 (866) 288-4268.

#### **Battery installation**

Install the battery, as shown below. Charge your wireless mic before initial use. The battery is fully charged after eight hours of continuous charging.




- 1. Plug the battery connector securely into the socket inside the battery compartment. Insert the battery with the label **THIS SIDE UP** facing up onto the battery compartment.
- 2. Slide the battery door until it clicks into place.
- 3. Place the wireless mic on the charging cradle until it is flush. The status indicator on the wireless mic turns orange when charging, and turns off when the battery is fully charged.



Use only the supplied rechargeable battery or replacement battery (model BT183642/

#### 1. Speakerphone

#### 2. LCD display

#### 3. Status indicator

• Indicates the system status. See Status indicators overview

- Press to show the menu.
- · Press to select an item, or save an entry or setting in a menu.

- While in a menu, press to return to the previous menu.
- While editing numbers or names, press to delete a character; or press and hold to delete all characters.

## **5.** VOL / ▼

- Press to scroll through the menu, phonebook, or call log.
- Press to adjust the ringer volume.
- During a call, press to adjust the listening volume.

#### TALK 6. OFF

· Press to make, answer, or end a call.

#### 7. Dialing keys

- Press to enter numbers or characters. OPER 0
- While entering numbers, press and hold to insert a dialing pause.
- While editing names, press to add a space.

#### TONE

• Press to switch to tone dialing temporarily when using pulse service while on a call.

#### 8. Front microphone

### MUTE

• During a call, press to mute or end mute all microphones in the system.

#### 10. REDIAL

• Press to redial the last number dialed.

#### 11. FLASH

• During a call, press to answer an incoming call when you receive a call waiting alert.

#### 12. Wireless mic

• See Quick reference guide - wireless mic.

#### 13. Charging contacts

#### 14. PHONEBOOK (▲)

· Press to access the phonebook when idle.

#### CALL LOG (▼)

• Press to access the call log when idle.

#### Menu Scroll (▲ / ▼)

- Press to scroll up or down while in the menu, phonebook, or call log.
- While entering names or numbers, press to move the cursor to right or left.



## Quick reference guide - wireless mic



#### 1. Microphone

• Functions as an extended microphone of the base unit during a call.

#### 2. Status indicator

• Indicates the system status. See Status indicators overview.

### 3. J (MUTE ALL)

• During a call, press to mute or end mute all microphones in the system.

#### 4. Battery door

#### Status indicators overview



#### Base unit status indicator

Power up	Turns green for about two seconds.
On a call	<ul><li>Turns green during a call.</li><li>Red when the system is muted during a call.</li></ul>
Incoming call	Flashes green when there is an incoming call.

#### Wireless mic status indicator



- Turns orange for about two seconds. Power up On the Turns orange when charging in the cradle cradle except during registration. Flashes red and green alternately, when the non-registered wireless mic is charging on the cradle. Off the Turns green during a call. cradle Turns red when the system is muted during a call.
  - Off when the wireless mic is in idle mode or without a battery. Flashes orange when the wireless mic's
  - battery is low. Flashes green when there is an incoming call.
  - Flashes red slowly when the wireless
    - · out of range; or
    - · not registered; or
  - off cradle during paging (with a paging tone).
- During Flashes red and green alternately. registration


#### 1. Status indicator

### 2. Rear microphone

### Initial settings

We recommend you program your base unit before use. The following are a few examples of common features to set before using the base unit. Refer to the Conference speakerphone settings in the user's manual for detailed instructions on setting all features.

#### Set date/time

Set the date/time before use.

- 1. Press MENU | SELECT -> ▼ or ▲ -> Set date/time -> MENU | SELECT
- 2. Enter the month, day and year using the dialing keys -> MENU
- 3. Enter the hour and minute using the dialing keys.
   4. ▼ or ▲ to choose AM or PM -> MENU SELECT.

#### Ringer volume

You can set the ringer volume level to one of the six levels, or turn the ringer off.

- Press VOL or NOL in idle mode to sample each ringer volume level -> MENU SELECT.
- 1. Press  $\frac{\text{MENU}}{\text{SELECT}}$  ->  $\blacktriangledown$  or  $\blacktriangle$  -> Ringers ->  $\frac{\text{MENU}}{\text{SELECT}}$
- 2. Press SELECT to select Ringer volume.
- 3. Press ▼ or ▲ to choose the desired level -> SELECT

#### Reset language to English

If you have accidentally changed the screen display language and want to switch it back to English, follow the step, as mentioned below.

Press MENU select in idle mode-> enter TONE **X364**#.

### Speakerphone operation

Operation	Steps
Making a call	Press TALK -> Enter the telephone number.
On-hook dialing (predialing)	Enter the telephone number -> Press TALK OFF to call.
Answering a call	Press TALK OFF.
Ending a call	Press TALK OFF.
Using a wireless mic to join a call in progress	During a call, push the wireless mic and lift it from the charging cradle.
Last number redial	Press <b>REDIAL</b> .
Volume control	Press VOL to increase or press to decrease the listening volume during a call.
Call waiting (Requires subscription from telephone service provider)	Press <b>FLASH</b> to put current call on hold and to take the new call; press <b>FLASH</b> again to switch back and forth between calls.
Temporary ringer silencing	When the base unit is ringing, press ALL .
Mute a call	During a call, press ALL on the base unit or 🎩 on a wireless mic.
Three-way conference	1. TALK 1. OFF -> Dial the number of the first call. 2. When the first call is connected, press FLASH. 3. Enter the number of the new outgoing call. 4. When the second call is connected, press FLASH.

### Caller ID

This product supports caller ID services offered by most telephone service providers. The base unit stores caller ID information for the last 50 incoming calls.

#### Missed call indicator

When the base unit is in idle mode and has new or missed calls, its screen shows **XX Missed calls**.

Each time after you reviewed a new call log entry, the number of missed calls decreases by one. If the base unit resumes power after power outage, the missed call indicator goes away.

#### Review and dial a number in the call log

- Press CALL LOG in idle mode -> ▼ or ▲ to scroll through the list.
   Press TALK OFF to call when the desired entry is displayed.

#### Save a call log entry to the phonebook

- Press CALL LOG in idle mode -> ▼ or ▲ -> MENU
   Press MENU SELECT -> Store to PB -> MENU SELECT.
- 3. Edit the telephone number -> MENU 4. Edit the name -> SELECT.

#### Phonebook

The phonebook can store up to 50 entries.

Operation	Steps
Adding an entry	1. Press MENU SELECT in idle mode.  2. Press SELECT to select Phonebook.  3. Press ▼ or ▲ -> Add contact -> MENU SELECT.  4. Enter a telephone number up to 30 digits -> MENU SELECT.  5. Enter a name up to 15 characters -> MENU SELECT.
Searching/ dialing an entry	<ol> <li>Press PHONEBOOK in idle mode.</li> <li>Press ▼ or ▲ to browse through the phonebook, or press the dialing keys (0-9) to start a name search.</li> <li>Press TALK OFF to call.</li> </ol>
